The Queen was President of Sandringham WI in Norfolk where she attended meeting while on her holidays there. In 1965 at the WIs golden jubilee which was held in Buckingham Palace gardens. The Queen very much enjoyed watching all the ladies trying to hold on their hats. It was a very windy day.

At WI centenary meeting lots of people will remember watching the Queen having a real problem cutting the cake. Both the Princess Royal and Duchess of Wessex having to lend a hand. Maybe not a very good advert for WI cakes.

At Shalford WI last meeting on 8th Sept.we had members telling us about items of royal membrablia they had. I had not heard the news that our Queen was ill, when I got home, it just felt so surreal. RIP to a fellow WI member. Shirley Wood, Shalford WI President.

Below is the speech that our late Queen gave to WI at our centenary speech at The Royal Albert Hall in June 2015.

I AM delighted to join you here today to the national annual general meeting in this, the 100th year of the national Women's Institute in Britain.

In the century since the first WI group was formed in North Wales and in Sussex, so much has changed for women in our society. There has been significant economic and social change since 1915. Women have been granted the vote; British women have climbed Everest for the first time, and the country has elected its first female Prime Minister. The Women's Institute has been a constant throughout, gathering women together, encouraging them to acquire new skills and nurturing women's talents. In the modern world, the opportunities for women to give something of value to society are greater than ever, because through their own efforts they now play a much greater part in all areas of public life.

Over the past 100 years the WI has continued to grow and evolve with its members, to stay relevant and forward thinking. In 2015 it continues to demonstrate that it can make a real difference to the lives of women of all ages and cultural backgrounds in a spirit of friendly co-operation and support. I congratulate you all on this significant occasion.

HRH Queen Elizabeth II

On Wednesday 14th September four of us went by train to 'see the Queen' and pay our respects. We hoped to view the laying-in-state procession. After taking the tube to Embankment we walked towards Horseguards along a marked route. There were plenty of people wearing 'information' banners. Eventually we came out directly into Horseguards opposite the Arch where the Mounted Life Guards were on duty. We then realised this was on the actual processional route. By this time it was 10.50 and the police started to put the barriers in place just in front of us. We decided to stay put with my sister and I being able to lean on the barriers. We stayed in the same spot for what turned out to be 4 hours. Time passed by watching the change of guards at 45 minute intervals. We knew when the 45 minutes was approaching as the horses started to become a bit restless and pawed the ground.

As expected there was a lot of security in place with men on top of buildings and looking out of top floor windows with binoculars keeping everyone safe. My sister said when I took the foil wrapped sandwiches out of my bag, the binoculars were trained down on me. She suggested we offered them egg or chicken! We were pleased to find that the numbers in the crowd were controlled by shutting off access from adjacent roads. The crowd was friendly with everyone hoping for a glimpse of the procession. With the gun salutes echoing and the procession started from Buckingham Palace the crowd went silent. A few people were looking at tv coverage on their phones. We waited for the sound of horses' hooves and people marching in time to the beat of a drum. Then the procession appeared through the archway and turned into the road. It was a magnificent and moving sight especially seeing the horse drawn gun carriage with the crown on top of the coffin followed by members of the royal family walking behind. The royal cars followed. The procession had passed us. After a few minutes the crowd quietly dispersed. This was the end to an amazing and never to be forgotten day in London. A day which exceeded our expectations in every way.

On Monday 19th September four of us set off by car to Windsor. We hoped to see the funeral procession as it proceeded along Long Walk. We walked towards the Castle through airport type security scanners into the cordoned off area beside the Long Walk. This area was large and well resourced with refreshments, toilets and giant screens with fantastic sound systems at varying positions all along the route. The live tv coverage was shown on the screens. The crowds were able to watch and hear the funeral service and procession in London. We hadn't anticipated being able to watch the event in London. This also meant we could keep in touch with



the timing and felt part of the whole event.

While we waited for the arrival of the cortège, the crowd was respectful and friendly with people standing up and joining in singing God Save The King. The crowd contained young and old with many in family groups who waited patiently for the procession. Guardsman, police and marines were positioned along the Long Walk. There were plenty of inspections and shuffling involved in getting everyone into their exact place, long before the procession's arrival. Officers on horseback went up and down periodically to

ensure all was well. There were human touches too such as each guardsman in turn were asked if they were ok. Prior to the arrival of the procession, the guardsman lowered their eyes before standing to attention on its arrival.

I was lent a small step to stand on by a thoughtful family and so had a wonderful view over people's heads right up to Windsor Castle with an uninterrupted view of the procession. The bands played and marched on with the mounted guardsmen on magnificent black horses. It was an unforgettable sight seeing close up the pageantry and the Queen's coffin draped in the Royal Standard adorned by the Crown, the orb, the sceptre and flowers. Gradually and silently apart from the accompanying music the procession moved into the distance towards Windsor Castle. The gates of the Castle finally opened.

We then reverted to watching the screens for the Committal Service. After which we returned home having witnessed a piece of history. Another never to be forgotten day came to an end.



Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II: the recent death of her Majesty the Queen will be something that stays in the minds of most of us for the rest of our lives. Very few of us will have more than a distant memory of the passing of the last monarch so the events around her death will be a once in a lifetime experience. The Council has sent a message of condolence to Kings Charles III and the Royal family on behalf of the council and our community and good wishes to the King going forward. Climate Emergency: the council continues to look at ways to be more environmentally aware and to encourage residents to be the same. Having declared a Climate Emergency at the May meeting we held a very successful meeting on 13th September with local residents to discuss how best to establish a group and what the priorities would be. The next meeting will take place on Wednesday 12th October in Shalford Village Upper Hall at 7pm when there will be a brainstorming exercise to draw up priorities and key initiatives. Please do join us if you can to share your ideas and join the group.

20's Plenty: like many residents we are concerned about the volume and speed of traffic through our villages and we are looking at this through our regular work and through the Climate Action group as well. This is a nationwide initiative to try and reduce traffic speeds in urban areas, and is gaining momentum all the time, and along with other local councils we hope to persuade Surrey CC to adopt a more positive attitude and approach to solving these problems.

Green and Silver Food Waste Caddies: we now have a stock of these at the Community Council office so if yours is broken or lost please do get in touch to collect a new one. **Shalford War Memorial:** members of the council had a very useful meeting with our insurers recently and we hope to conclude our discussions and come to an agreement on the insurance settlement very soon.



Local Elections: next May local elections will be held when all our Community Councillors as well as our Guildford BC councillors need to stand for re-election or be replaced with new candidates. We are always on the lookout for new blood to support the council from people who know about your own village and who are interested in helping to make the village a better place to live. No particular skills are needed other than a willingness to give some of your time to regular meetings and a desire to help improve where you live. If you would like to know more about the role of a Community Councillor please do get in touch with Nuala, our Clerk. Date of next Parish Council meetings next full meetings will be on Thursday 20th October and Thursday November 17th – venues to be confirmed. Planning Committee will take place on Monday 24th October and Monday 21st November in Shalford Village Hall.

A Remarkably Neat and Genteel Village (Pigots Directory, 1823)

It's two hundred years since the 1820s when Henry Edmund Austen carried out a programme of improvements to the village on the doorstep of his mansion (Shalford House, demolished in 1967). The heart of Shalford in those days was The Street beside the parish church and the Mill. Shalford was on the turnpike road to the south coast: the King, George IV, frequently passed through on the way to his new Pavilion at Brighton. John Sparkes, the miller at Shalford Mill, remarked in 1822 that 'Our village will become very popular, three stage coaches passes daily.' Dream on, today's residents!

Mr Austen owned most of the property in and around the village. He wanted the village to reflect well on him though he complained constantly about the expense of all the work. He had the frontages of the timber-framed cottages in The Street rendered over to give them a more up-to-date appearance. He instructed the villagers to keep their windows repaired and The Street clean and to stop growing grape vines on the roofs of their houses (!). In 1826 he remodelled Lemon Bridge Cottage, on the corner of East Shalford Lane, raising the roof to accommodate 'Gothic' windows with the fashionable ogee curve.

The Seahorse's appearance dates from that time as well – in 1822 the exterior was covered with rough cast rendering, and a slate roof, new regularly-spaced windows and a stable added.

The pretty village was widely admired and attracted tenants who could pay higher rents for the larger houses — army and navy officers and middle class professionals who were moving from London (what's new?) Mr Austen's land agent boasted that houses in Shalford could attract the same rents as those in Bath. This must be an overstatement. But to reassure his employer that his money was well-spent he declared: 'The village of Shalford is spoken of go where you will for its good repair and neatness.'

Now the traffic thunders by and the old village has been replaced as the heart of Shalford by the new centre that grew up by the Common in the nineteenth century. It's still worth a walk round the old village though to try to spot some of these Georgian alterations.

Lemon Bridge Cottage. Note the 'gothic' windows. Above the upstairs windows you can just make out the height of the original walls before the roof was raised. (My father drew this at my request in 1994 from the original in the Godwin-Austen collection at Surrey History Centre)



Bell ringing news

It has been a particularly busy time for the bellringers of St Mary's, following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II. We received an official protocol from The Royal Household and Lambeth Palace in which their guidance seta out quite clearly when and how the bells should be rung.

Our first ring was on Friday 9th September at midday and was fully muffled with the tenor bell half-muffled at handstroke. The muffles themselves are made of leather with straps and they are tied around the clapper of each bell. We have never rung fully muffled before, only half-muffled which meant that our steeple-keeper, Dave Hester, had to collect up as many muffles as he could find and then layer them to get the desired result. Later on that day



we rang fully muffled again at the end of the screening of the Service of Thanksgiving at St Paul's.

The next day, Saturday the 10th, we rang for the Proclamation in celebration of the accession of the new Monarch. We timed this for 4pm and for this we rang "Open" (unmuffled). Then the band travelled into Guildford to ring again at St Nicolas who do not have their own band of ringers, so we felt it was very important that they should have bell ringing on this important day.

As I write this, we have now rung for the Thanksgiving service ringing on Sunday 11th, this time half muffled, which means that one stroke is open and the other muffled. We continue to ring half-muffled up to the Funeral with Tolling before the time of the Funeral Service (up to one hour).

My thanks to all the band for their help in providing ringing during the last three days, particularly Sue Saunders and David Wholey for taking time out from work at short notice. And a big thank you to Dave Hester for all the time he has spent putting on muffles and then taking them off, only to put another set back on.


